ROMAN PERIOD IN SAMOGITIA
Around AD 0-400

During the Roman period, Samogitia was an integral part of the Baltic coast provinces, and the Roman influence was felt in the region. The Roman period in Samogitia is characterized by the presence of Roman artifacts, such as coins, glass, and metal objects. THE FIRST SAMOGITIA
Around 400-800 AD
